

## OUR SCHOOLS

### École Maternelle Patricia Chairs *Preschool*

- Opened in 2015 in rented facility
- New school building completed and welcomed students in Fall 2017
- 4 classes of half-day preschool
- 191 3- and 4-year olds enrolled 2017-18
- 15 Haitians employed
- Students selected from the poorest areas in Saint Marc; no open enrollment
- Students receive meals daily
- 2 LBS Alumni currently employed as aides in the classroom

### Les Bons Samaritains (LBS) *Primary School*

- Opened in 2001 in Saint Marc, Haiti
- Served K-9 through 2011, now serves K-6 with an average of 2 classes per grade
- 508 students enrolled 2017-18
- 41 Haitians employed
- Students can only enter from our preschool
- Students receive 2 meals each day
- Dental clinic twice a year
- Annual visit from eye doctor
- School includes library, science & computer labs
- Computer, English & Music classes begin in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade
- Adjacent residence lodges up to 15 visitors

### Collège James M. Stine (CJMS) *Secondary School*

- Opened September 2011
- Serves grades 7-13
- 585 students enrolled 2017-18
- Of the 585, 138 are graduates of LBS
- School run by the Clercs de St. Viateur (Catholic priests & brothers)
- Dental clinic twice a year
- School includes library, science & computer labs
- Student band
- Consistently ranked in the top three schools in the Dept. of the Artibonite with near perfect passing rates
- Nearly all graduates are currently enrolled at University



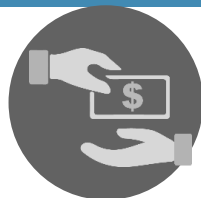

### Notre Dame de Lamercie *Literacy School*

- Opened in 2002
- 102 students enrolled 2017-18
- 5 Haitians employed
- 4-year cycle for adults, especially LBS parents



### MicroFinance & Artisanship

To aid the under- and un-employed in starting small business projects in and around Saint Marc



### Technical Center

To offer various trades including mechanic, electrical, plumbing, carpentry, masonry, etc.



### Agriculture

To prepare individuals to assist farmers in boosting productivity and efficiency in the Dept. of the Artibonite, a region of Haiti known for agriculture & fertile land



### English

To teach conversational English to teachers, employees, and others within our school system
